

American College Testing Program (ACT)

ACT: Overview

The American College Testing Assessment (ACT) is a national college admission examination that consists of tests in English, Mathematics, Reading and Science Reasoning. The ACT includes 215 multiple-choice questions and takes approximately 3 hours and 30 minutes to complete. Actual testing time is 2 hours and 55 minutes. The ACT is given six times a year. ACT results are accepted by virtually all U.S. colleges and universities.

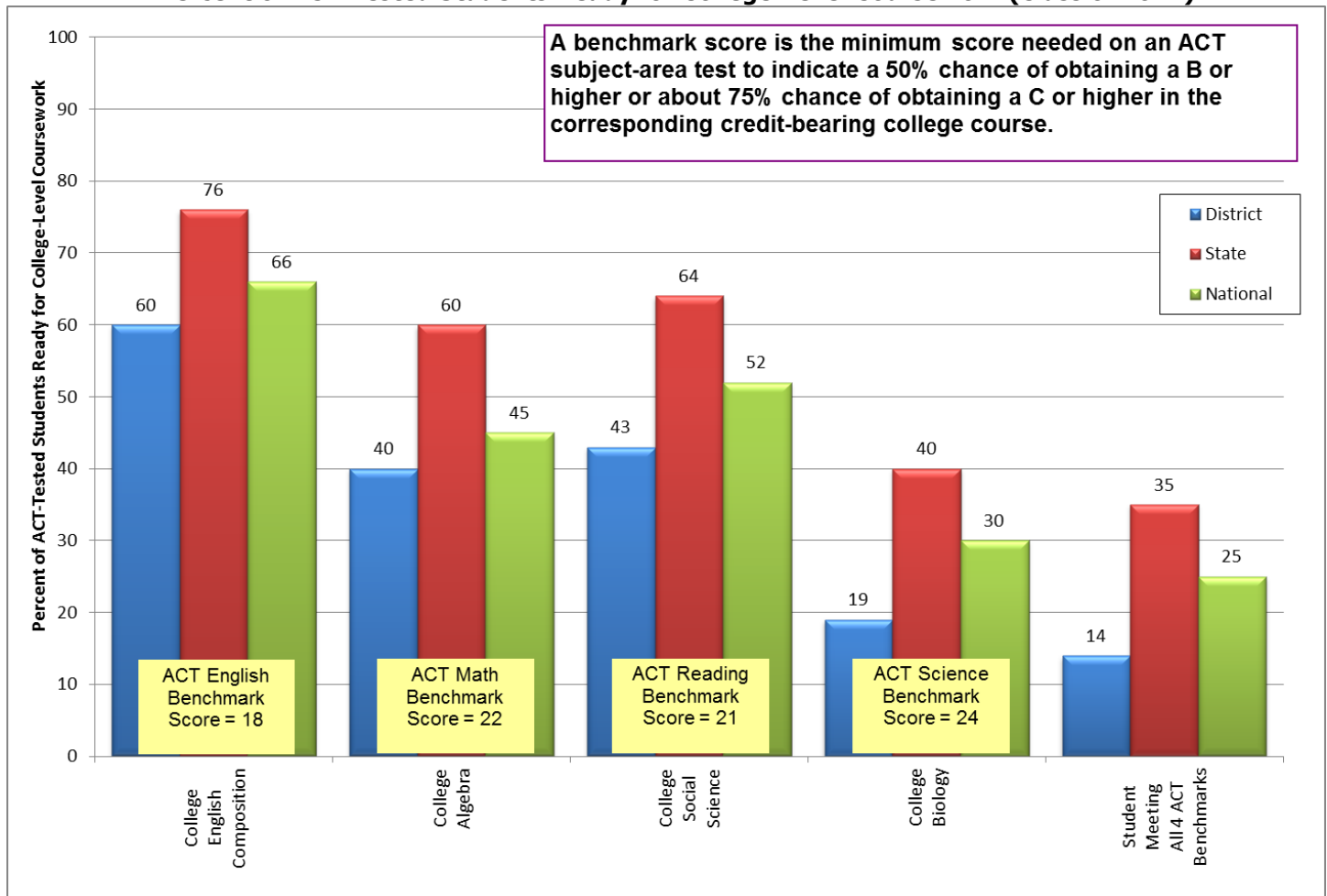
